Jesus' Crucifixion and Resurrection Matthew 26:36–28:10; John 18:1–20:18

MAIN POINT: JESUS DIED ON THE CROSS TO SAVE PEOPLE FROM SIN, AND HE IS ALIVE.

Jesus prayed to God, "Father! If it is possible, take this suffering away from Me. But only if it is part of Your plan." Suddenly Judas arrived with a large crowd. The crowd arrested Jesus. Jesus was led to the high priest. The high priest asked, "Are You the Messiah, the Son of God?"

Jesus replied, "Yes, that's right."

The high priest said, "He has spoken against God. He deserves to die!"

When morning came, the religious leaders led Jesus to Pilate, the governor.

"Are You the King of the Jews?" Pilate asked. "Yes, that's right," Jesus replied. Pilate asked the crowd what he should do. "Crucify Him!" they said.

The governor's soldiers put a scarlet robe on Jesus. They made a crown of thorns and put it on His head. Then they mocked Him, beat Him, and led Him away to be killed.

The soldiers nailed Jesus to a cross. Two criminals were crucified next to Him. Jesus cried out, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" Then Jesus died. His body was buried in a tomb.




