Key Passage: Acts 1:8

Christ Connection: Paul taught the people in Athens about the one true God. He told them that Jesus died on the cross and is alive! People can know God because Jesus brings us into God's family.

Big Picture Question and Answer: How do people hear about Jesus? God uses Christians to tell others about Jesus.

Main Point for Babies and Toddlers: Christians tell about Jesus.

Main Point for Preschoolers: Paul taught the people in Athens about the one true God.

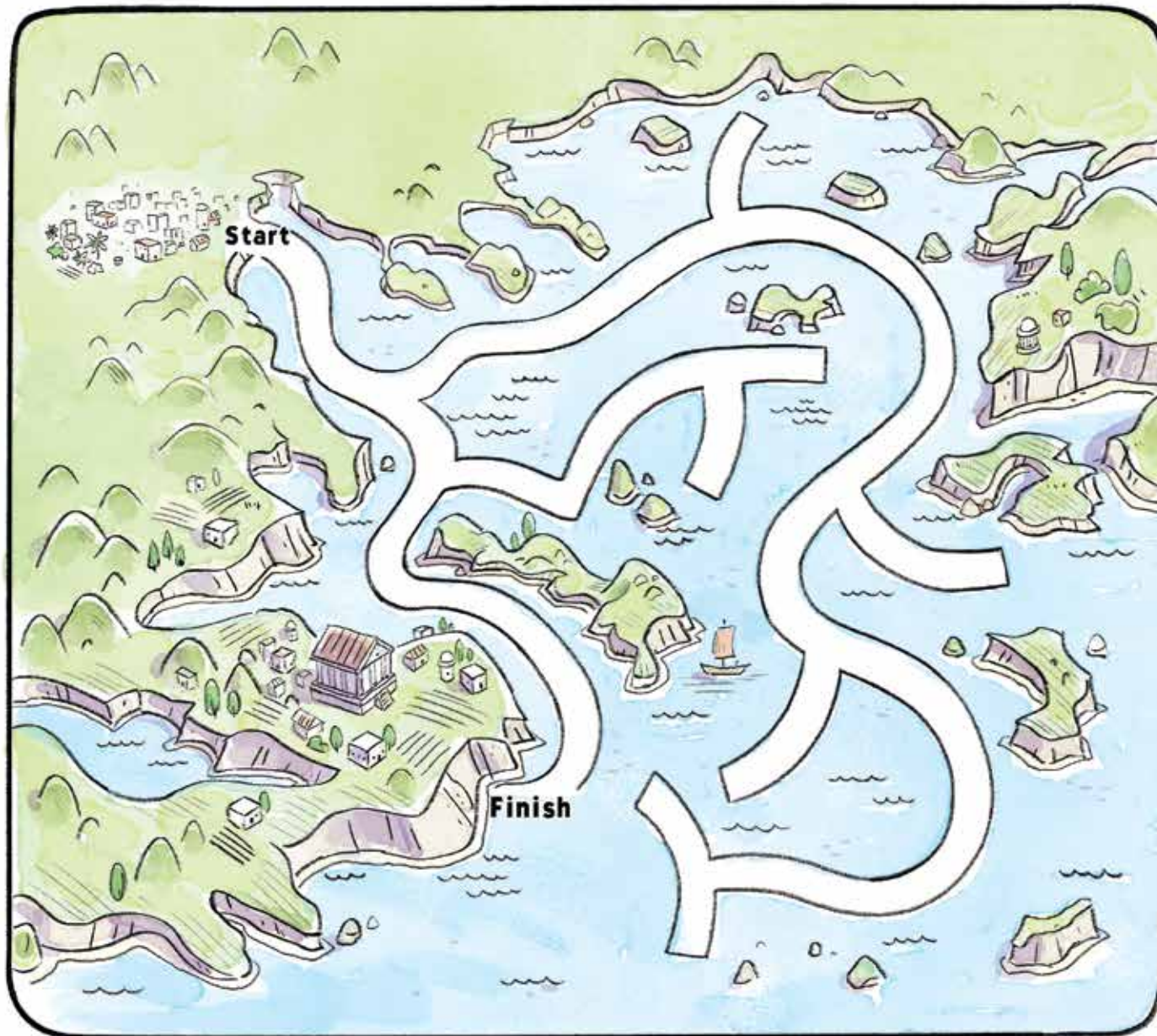
Bible Story Points:

- Paul said God made all people and He loves them.
- God sent Jesus to earth to rescue us.

KEY PASSAGE: Acts 1:8

- Some people believed in Jesus.

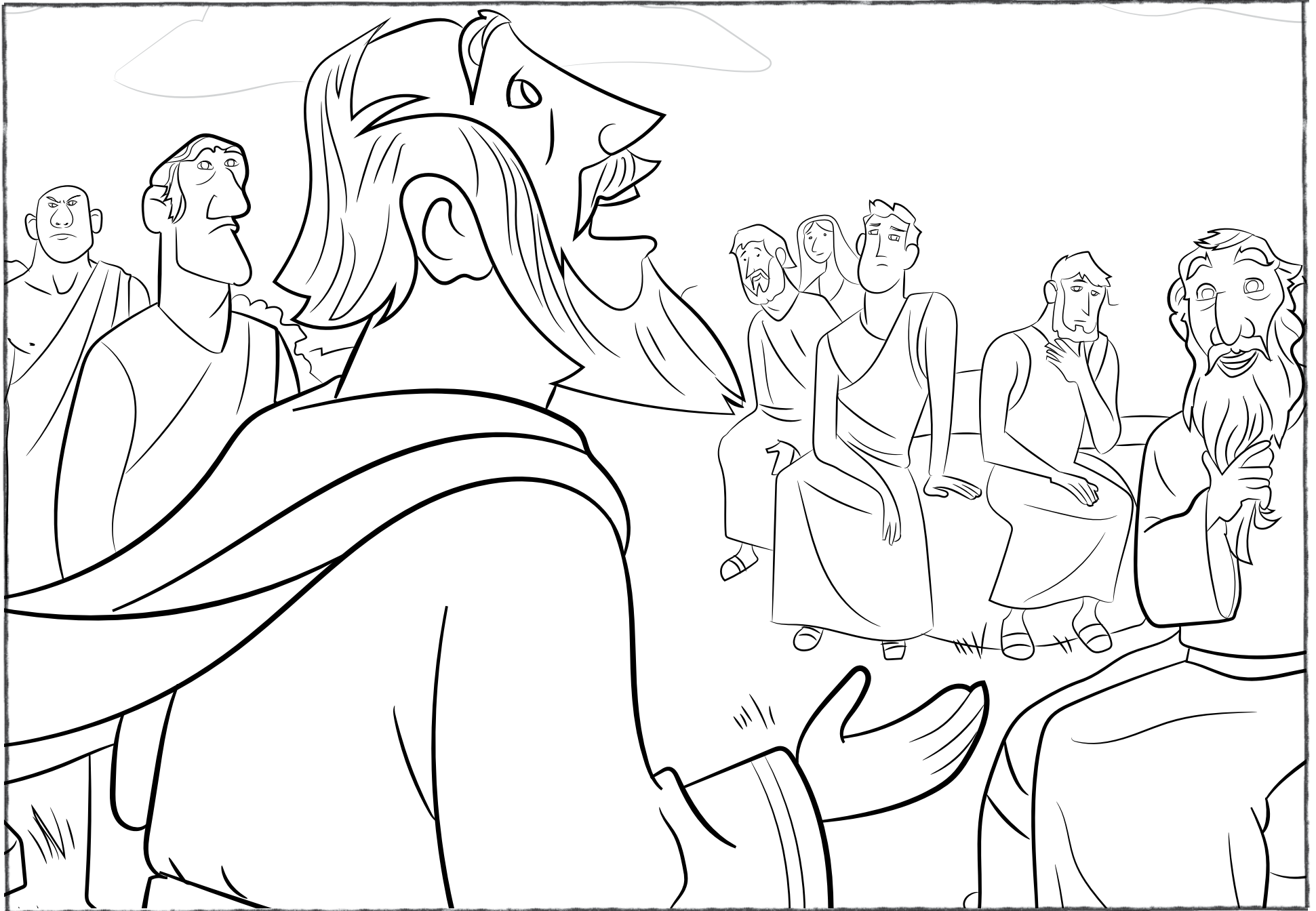
FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

- Identify a people group that worships false gods. Pray that God would send missionaries to tell them the truth about Jesus.

“Journey with Paul” Instructions

Session 1 – Paul’s Conversion and Baptism

- Print and cut apart the Bible story images of Paul, Ananias, and the bright light. Attach adhesive hook-and-loop fasteners to each figure.
- Give an image to each toddler.
- Drape a flannelgraph or felt sheet over the table or to a child-size easel.
- As you read the Bible story, guide the toddlers to place the Bible story images on the flannelgraph.

Session 2 – Paul’s First Journey

- Print and cut apart the Bible story images of Barnabas, the man on the mat, and the crowd. Use Paul from the previous week. Attach adhesive hook-and-loop fasteners to each figure.
- Give an image to each toddler.
- Drape a flannelgraph or felt sheet over the table or to a child-size easel.
- As you read the Bible story, guide the toddlers to place the Bible story images on the flannelgraph.

Session 3 – The Message: “Christ Alone”

- Print and cut apart the Bible story images of the Jewish and non-Jew believers. Use Paul and Barnabas from previous weeks. Attach adhesive hook-and-loop fasteners to each figure.
- Give an image to each toddler.
- Drape a flannelgraph or felt sheet over the table or to a child-size easel.
- As you read the Bible story, guide the toddlers to place the Bible story images on the flannelgraph.

Session 4 – Paul’s Second Journey

- Print and cut apart the Bible story images of Lydia, the jailer, and Silas. Use Paul from previous weeks. Attach adhesive hook-and-loop fasteners to each figure.
- Give an image to each toddler.
- Drape a flannelgraph or felt sheet over the table or to a child-size easel.
- As you read the Bible story, guide the toddlers to place the Bible story images on the flannelgraph.
